### Flood Situation Report-04

Reporting Date: July 13, 2017

Till today, the Brahmaputra and Jamuna river systems are in rising trend. The upstream flow of water is more than before and increased the water level of different rivers. The Brahmaputra, Jamuna, Ghagot and Dharla river are flowing above danger level in different points and the Teesta is falling trend.

In that circumstances, all rivers of the Bramaputra and Ghaghot river are flowing above of the DL and may slightly rise in next 24 hours. According to FFWC, the Teesta is falling trend and the water level of Brahmaputra may to slightly rise in next 24 hours.

28 unions of Gaibandha district are affected while 4.8 Lac people are marooned and 850 families are

displaced and taken shelter at different places. Affected people are facing crisis of drinking water, dry food, fodder and facing sanitation problems.

Flood affected people are facing crisis of pure drinking water, dry food and sanitation problem. Fodder and shelter for livestock has become a grave concern.



By this time river erosion has made worsen in char and both side of the Teesta, Dharla and Brahmaputra rivers. Due to river erosion about 5966 families are displaced, 132 different educational institutions are closed. Till today, 3 children at Gaibandha have died downed in flood water and a man of 60 years old has died by snack bit at Fazlupur union of Fulchari upazila in Gaibandha.

Communication systems of the affected areas are disrupted. About, 16000 flood affected families have taken shelter in different places. Most of the education institutions are closed in 98 unions at river basin area.

### **Government's initiatives:**

Up to 12 July' 17, district and 4 upazila administration of Gaibandha have distributed 225 Ton rice, 1.5 Lac TK & 2000 pack dry food to flooded people and engaged 75 health team; district and upazila's administration of Kurigram have distributed 300 Ton rice, 8.25 Lac TK & 2000 pack dry food; At Lalmonirhat, district administration has distributed 123 Ton rice, 10 Lac Tk, 1000 packets dry food to 26199 families of 17 unions 4 upazils to flooded people.



### **Initiative of GUK:**

We have rescued 389 families in 4 upazilas of Gaibandha and 7500 liters safe drinking water has been distributed among 350 families from Balasi ghat by 3 boats. The staffs and volunteer also are collecting the information by spot verification of the affected areas.

### **Recommendation: The Teesta is falling trend; the Bromaputar is in Slightly Rising trend.**

Presently, there are needed dry foods, WASH facilities, ORS, fodder and child recreation center at shelter place.
